## Low-Performing Students Block Grant

March 12, 2019

### **Low-Performing Students Block Grant Details:**

This is a one-time grant that serves students identified as low-performing on state English language arts or mathematics assessments. Eligible students are not otherwise identified for supplemental grant funding under the LCFF and are not eligible Special Education services

The Low-Performing Students Block Grant requires a plan describing how the funds will provide support for students and must be approved by the Local Governing Board and submitted to the state by March 15, 2019. A final report will be due to the state in November 2021.

### **School Plan for Low Performing Students Block Grant:**

- Will provide small group tutoring to support ELA/Math
  - Will provide 1:1 support to students to support ELA/Math
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
