Uniform Complaint Procedures

Community Relations

The Grizzly Challenge Charter School Board of Directors recognizes that the Grizzly Challenge Charter School (GCCS) has the primary responsibility to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing its educational programs. The Board encourages the early resolution of complaints whenever possible. To resolve complaints which may require a more formal process, the Board adopts the uniform system of complaint processes specified in 5 CCR 4600-4670.

GCCS

Complaints Subject to UCP

GCCS's uniform complaint procedures (UCP) shall be used to investigate and resolve complaints regarding the following programs and activities:

- 1. Accommodations for pregnant and parenting students (Education Code 46015)
- 2. Career technical and technical education and career technical and technical training programs (Education Code 52300-52462)
- 3. Compensatory education (Education Code 54400)
- 4. Consolidated categorical aid programs (Education Code 33315; 34 CFR 299.10-299.12)
- 5. Course periods without educational content(Education Code 51228.1-51228.3)
- 6. Discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying in GCCS programs and activities, including in those programs or activities funded directly by or that receive or benefit from any state financial assistance, based on a person's actual or perceived characteristics of race or ethnicity, color, ancestry, nationality, national origin, immigration status, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital status, pregnancy, parental status, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, gender expression, or genetic information, or any other characteristic identified in Education Code 200 or 220, Government Code 11135, or Penal Code 422.55, or based on a person's association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics
- 7. Educational and graduation requirements for students in foster care, homeless students, students from military families, students formerly in a juvenile court school (Education Code 48645.7, 48853, 48853.5, 49069.5, 51225.1, 51225.2)
- 8. Every Student Succeeds Act (Education Code 52059.5; 20 USC 6301 et seq.)

- 9. Local control and accountability plan (Education Code 52075)
- 10. Migrant education (Education Code 54440-54445)
- 11. Physical education instructional minutes (Education Code 51210, 51222, 51223)
- 12. Pregnant and Parenting Pupils Accommodations (Education Code 46015)
- 13. Student fees (Education Code 49010-49013)
- 14. Reasonable accommodations to a lactating student (Education Code 222)
- 15. School plans for student achievement as required for the consolidated application for specified federal and/or state categorical funding (Education Code 64001)
- 16. School safety plans (Education Code 32280-32289)
- 17. School site councils as required for the consolidated application for specified federal and/or state categorical funding (Education Code 65000)
- 18. Any complaint alleging retaliation against a complainant or other participant in the complaint process or anyone who has acted to uncover or report a violation subject to this policy
- 19. Any other state or federal educational program the Superintendent of Public Instruction or designee deems appropriate

At its discretion, GCCS may use the UCP for any other type of complaint as specified in a GCCS policy or regulation. (5 CCR 4610).

All complainants shall be protected from retaliation, and the confidentiality of the parties shall be protected as required by law. For any complaint alleging retaliation or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), the identity of the complainant, and/or the subject of the complaint if different from the complainant, shall remain confidential when appropriate and as long as the integrity of the complaint process is maintained.

Records of all UCP complaints and the investigations of those complaints are to be maintained in accordance with applicable law and GCCS policies and procedures.

Non-UCP Complaints:

The following complaints shall not be subject to GCCS's UCP but shall be investigated and resolved by the specified agency or through an alternative process:

- 1. Any complaint alleging child abuse or neglect shall be referred to the County Department of Social Services Protective Services Division or the appropriate law enforcement agency. (5 CCR 4611)
- 2. Any complaint alleging that a student, while in an education program or activity in which GCCS exercises substantial control over the context and respondent, was subjected to sexual harassment as defined in 34 CFR 106.30 shall be addressed through the federal Title IX complaint procedures as specified in 34 CFR 106.44 106.45.
- 3. Any complaint alleging employment discrimination or harassment shall be referred to the GCCS Principal for investigation using GCCS procedures, including the right to file the complaint with the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing.
- 4. Any complaint alleging a violation of a state or federal law or regulation related to special education, a settlement agreement related to the provision of a free appropriate public education (FAPE) failure, or refusal to implement a due process hearing order to which GCCS is subject, or a physical safety concern that interferes with GCCS's provision of FAPE shall be submitted to California Department of Education (CDE).
